Dear parents/carers,

Yesterday we held a morning tea to thank our wonderful parent and community helpers. I am so sorry I was unable to be there. Unfortunately I was booked to attend a Principals conference and was therefore unable to be there personally to thank everyone. As a school community we rely so much on the generosity, commitment and contributions of our volunteers. At Engadine Public School we are fortunate to have strong support from our community and that means that our students are offered exceptional learning opportunities which are supported by a tireless and hardworking group of volunteers. From reading groups to classroom helpers; P&C support to excursions; Code Club to Scripture - our volunteers are the best! People Power

It is exciting that we are growing in number and next year we will have three Kindergarten classes. As such, I am pleased to advise you that we will be having another classroom installed over the coming weeks. Barricades and site fencing will be erected next week and then we need to cross our fingers for good weather so the builders can work uninterrupted. The importance of spacious and comfortable learning spaces cannot be overstated and I am pleased to say that all new demountable classrooms now come with air-conditioning as standard fit out. Over the holiday period I will be organising furniture, technology such as computers and an Interactive Whiteboard, telephones and more - busy times ahead!

Presentation Day is fast approaching and, as it is a slightly different format and a new location this year, there are a few housekeeping items of which to be aware. The proceedings will start at Engadine High School at 12 noon therefore we will aim to leave school with the students at 11am. Students will have an early lunch on the day at 10:20am. Students will need to take a water bottle and hat with them to Engadine High School – no food or bags will be taken. Therefore, if you are planning to take your child home directly from the High School, you will need to pick up his/her school bag from our school. Alternatively, send your child with their lunch and drink in a disposable bag for that day. As usual, teachers will





have class lists with them and names will need to be checked of the role before children leave for the day. Engadine High School has been most gracious in lending us their school hall and in providing us with technical support on the day. Our staff are working hard to prepare the running order for the day and it looks like it will be a wonderful event.

At school this week I can feel the excitement in the air as our Yr. 6 students are preparing to don the greasepaint and tread the boards in next week's production, Rock Bottom! Mrs. McAlpine, Mrs Mitchell and our cast and crew from Yr.6 are all ready to blow you away with a very polished performance. I hope to see many of you there next Wednesday evening.

Currently I am working my way through the final reading and signing of reports and I am confident that parents will be proud of the progress and application of our students throughout the year. Reports will go home at the beginning of week 9.

COSOP Sustainability Science Student Conference

Last week 6 year 4 students attended the COSOTP Sustainability Science Student Conference in the Royal National Park. Below is a recount of their day from 2 of our students who attended.

On Wednesday 21st of November 6 students from year 4 went to the Royal national Park Environment Centre. We did fun activities such as "our war on waste", where we placed the rubbish in the correct bins (lowest waste, low waste, high waste, and highest waste). We learnt how to take pictures without zooming or using a filter. The different skills we learnt included macro, ants eye view, landscape, colour, down to up, up to down, and to get up a grid on the camera. We made insects out of bottle caps and we made badges about the "War on Waste".

We grew plants using mint leaves and others. We learned how to reproduce plants, where rubbish goes. Half of our group had a look at the compost, it was in a bathtub we built a compost bin made out of cardboard, fishnet, rubber bands and we used a drill to drill holes. The other half of the group learnt what a vertical garden is and what it does. We also made posters about waste and how it is bad and does bad things to the environment. 


















THE JOHN FRANKLIN






