#### **Restorative Practice**

#### ASKING QUESTIONS THAT WORK

Restorative Questions 1

- What happened?
- What were you thinking at the time?
- What have you thought about since?
- Who has been affected by what you have done? In what way?
- What do you think you need to do to make things right?
- What will you do differently next time?

These questions are about story, challenge, reflection and reparation of harm. They have been designed to build a strong relational basis with which to work in any relationship. The structure of the questions focus on the past (what happened?) present (reflection on who has been affected and in what way) and future (what needs to be done to make things right?) the questions therefore focus on harm and relationship. They are also:

- Devoid of blame
- Respectful and not value laden
- Thinking questions rather than feeling ones which ironically tend to evoke better feeling responses
- Have the potential to stimulate empathy and growth.

REMEMBER – Avoid asking the WHY question (why did you do that?) Have you ever had a child give you a satisfactory answer when you have asked them why they did something wrong?

#### Restorative Questions 2

What did you think when you realised what had happened?

What impact has this incident had on you and others? What has been the hardest thing for you?

What do you think needs to happen to make things right?

These questions offer a voice for people who have been harmed by the actions of another. The questions ask for a factual and non-judgemental response. With a focus on the impact of an action or incident, the person who has been harmed speaks to his/her most authentic audience i.e. the person who has caused the harm. The outcome is that responsibility for reparation is laid appropriately upon the shoulders of the person who has caused the harm.
