Dear Parents/carers,

On Wednesday evening we were treated to a musical spectacular, as our Yr. 6 students performed 'Robin and his Sherwood Hoodies'. What an amazing production! Yr.6 students all excelled as they worked together, delivering impeccably timed one-liners and treading the boards in style. To all the Yr. 6 students congratulations! From those on music and lighting, to those on stage. You really did yourselves proud and what a wonderful memory to take with you from Primary School. Thank you to the many staff who helped bring it all together. As you can imagine, a production like this takes many months of preparation: painting the back-drop, making the costumes and props, ticketing, make-up, many, many rehearsals and so much more. A very special thanks must go to our two resident creative talents, Mrs. MacAlpine and Mrs. Mitchell, for their unwavering

faith in the students, for their incredible commitment and hard work and for their capacity to make fantastic casting choices! We are so pleased that these two remarkable women put their hands up every year to do it all again. Certainly this must be a labour of love, as they definitely don't get paid enough to do this!!

During this week we celebrated International Day of Disabilities and we were lucky enough to have a guest speaker attend and inspire our students on Wednesday. Sarah Walsh, a young Paralympian and daughter of Trish Walsh (an SLSO at the school) spoke with students about her disability, her hard work and her success on the athletics field representing Australia. It is so wonderful to share such stories with our students so they can connect with and develop a true understanding of life from different perspectives. Many thanks to Trish and Sarah for enabling this visit.

Our PBL focus over the last two weeks has been on Walking on hard surfaces to keep us Safe. This two week focus has helped students to think and act in a safe manner. The winning classes have been drawn and have negotiated a prize of their choice, which has been a real motivator for everyone. For the remaining two weeks (8 days, actually!!) of term we will be focusing on Lining Up Respectfully and Responsibly. All classes will be participating in lessons which will provide various contexts, opportunities for role play and practice throughout the day. Staff will be looking out to reinforce and reward expected behaviour – at morning lines, at the end of recess and lunch and at canteen. Let's finish the year on a positive note with more prizes for the winning classes!

As we work to embed PBL into the fabric of our school day and general operations, it will involve some necessary changes and streamlining of our





awards system and our signage around the school. You would be aware that as a school we are developing a new Engadine Public School PBL mascot. Students are all engaged in researching, designing and drawing their suggestions for our new mascot and we will all vote to decide on the winning entry at the end of term. This is important as it will become a visual and easily identifiable symbol of our positive expectations. Over the holidays some of our current signage will be removed - this is all part of the process of having one set of clear, consistent expectations across all school areas. The Keys to Success signs will be removed and that wall will become a space where we can display new signage with our new mascot and four expectations - Safe, Respectful, Responsible, Learners. Our award system will align with our expectations: students will need to collect 10 awards, with at least one coming from each of our four expectation areas, in order to earn a silver award. This is an exciting journey we're all on and once we can all see, say, think and do what is expected students, staff and community will all feel better supported.

I am looking forward to next week – the pinnacle of our year in many respects, as we all gather to acknowledge and celebrate our students' sporting and academic successes.

# **Parents not Partners**

This is a six-session program for separated parents in conflict over their children. It is designed to improve emotional and developmental outcomes for children in separated families by:

- raising parents' awareness of the impact on their children of the ongoing conflict in their family
- providing them with knowledge, tips and strategies to be able to focus on their children rather than on their issues or conflicts with the other parent

#### Parents will learn:

- ways to better regulate their emotions and to self-care ways to help their children manage their emotions
- to recognise the effects of ongoing, mismanaged conflict on children
- skills to better manage conflict with the other parent
- to reorient interactions with their child's other parent to be respectful and cooperative
- to recognise and differentiate between their own and their children's individual needs
- skills to communicate effectively with the other parent

to reflect on their behaviour and make changes where needed
